From the Superintendent



Dear Comstock Schools Community,

In my discussions with community members regarding the upcoming construction projects, there have been several recurring questions. I thought it

would be helpful if I shared the answers with everyone.

Why isn't the work being done over the summer?

There are several reasons why the project timeline is during the school year. The main reasons are:

- Design and estimation lead time
- Contractor Pool
- Project Pricing

The bond vote occurred in May, 2016, and bonds were then sold in the summer of 2016. From there, the preliminary design and cost estimation process began. The district worked with Miller-Davis (Construction Manager) and GMB (Architects and Engineers) to create the preliminary designs and the cost estimates. Given the desire of the district to complete as much work in the first series of bonds as possible, the district went through several series of initial design and estimates. When the final estimate came back below the allocated funds, GMB went to work to develop all of the drawings and specifications needed to bid the projects.

Preparing drawings and specifications for the \$8 million projects took hundreds of pages of specifications and dozens of drawings for each project. There were 14 major bid categories in the project.

In discussions with Miller-Davis and GMB, I asked what should we do to maximize the taxpayers' money and ensure we receive the best bids possible? They recommended anything we could do to modify the schedule to bid the project when contractors are not fully booked during the summer.

With that in mind, we made the decision to bid the project with a timeline beginning in the fall of 2017. The recommendation worked and the bids came in below budget. The time spent on the multiple revisions of preliminary design and cost estimates allowed the district to maximize the funds available. Additionally, contractors expressed their interest and availability because the project started after all their summer work was completed.

What will be done to ensure student safety during construction?

The District, Miller-Davis and GMB all are focused on ensuring student, staff, visitor and worker safety. Miller-Davis and GMB have extensive experience in doing construction projects in occupied spaces. Miller-Davis has designed a site-specific separation plan for each of the buildings. They will have an onsite construction superintendent while construction is going on. Miller-Davis has written safety plans for each contractor onsite.

Miller-Davis and the district will erect signage and fencing outside to prevent students and visitors from entering the construction area. Inside, Miller-Davis will construct separation walls to physically separate students, staff and visitors from entering the construction areas. Miller-Davis has developed plans to prevent construction traffic and activities during the student drop-off/pick-up times. Additionally, there will be specific times for deliveries and material shipments to avoid conflicts with school traffic.

Miller-Davis qualifies each contractor for the project by reviewing their written safety plans, work-related accident histories and their experience with school construction. Overall, the District, Miller-Davis and GMB have gone to great lengths to provide and promote the safest construction sites possible.

Why are the locker rooms being remodeled in the spring of 2018?

In looking at the sports and physical education schedules and trying to have the least amount of impact on the operation of the high school, all those involved determined that beginning in the

spring of 2018 presented the best option. The locker rooms will be available for the majority of sports which use them and for a good portion of the physical education classes before they are taken offline for remodeling. The new locker rooms will be ready to go for the fall of 2018.

I thought the high school and NEMS were going to be remodeled?

They are. NEMS remodeling is the major portion of the second series in the bond issue which will be issued in late 2018 or early 2019. The high school remodeling is in the third series of bonds which will be issued in late 2021 or early 2022. The bonds are being issued in series to save on interest costs to taxpayers.



DISTRICT ANNUAL NOTIFICATIONS

Confidentiality of Educational Records

The school district has compiled records on all students for use in the provision of appropriate education programs and services. Federal and State legislation provides parents and eligible students (18 years and older) with certain rights regarding the confidentiality of school records.

Student Records

- Personal and family data
- Health and immunization records
- Test data including aptitude, interest, intelligence, and achievement testing
- Achievement and attendance records
- Anecdotal records
- Records of conferences
- Copies of correspondence concerning a student
- Student questionnaires
- Other records which may contribute to the understanding of the student
- Past school records from other districts
- Individualized educational plans for handicapped students

Procedures Relating to Retention, Destruction, and Disclosure of Records

Records are maintained at the building in which the student is enrolled or last attended. Each record is kept in an individual file open only to those personnel who have a need to know. Information on grades, attendance, and courses completed are kept forever unless transferred to another school district. Portions of a record may be destroyed when it is no longer appropriate to retain them.

Parental and Student Rights

Parents of a student or an eligible student have the right to:

- Inspect and review the educational records of the student
- Request information contained in such records be amended if it is inaccurate, misleading or violates the privacy or other rights of the student.

• Request a hearing to challenge the content of the student's record.

Access Procedures

Parents or eligible students who wish to review the student's educational records shall request at the attending building. A review shall be scheduled within a reasonable time not to exceed thirty days.

Disclosure to Third Parties

Personally identifiable information from the educational record of the student shall not be released without the prior consent of the parent or eligible student. Information may be released to certain individuals or agencies as permitted by law.

Directory Information

The district provides directory information which includes: name, address, telephone, date and place of birth, weight and height, participation in school activities, dates of attendance, awards received, and other similar information. Directory information may be released unless parent or eligible student refuses such release. The refusal must be made to the superintendent's office within 10 days of the publication of this notice.

Special Education and Section 504 Notifications

It is the policy of the district to actively find and provide services to handicapped students. The district will provide appropriate evaluations, identification and services for all eligible students under Section 504 of the Vocational Rehabilitation Act of 1973 or current special education laws.

Administrative Policies and Procedures Complaint Procedures

The district does not discriminate on the basis of disability, sex, age, or race with regard to admission, access to services, treatment, or employment in programs and activities.

The district has a coordinator responsible for Section 504, the American Disabilities Act and Special Education. Contact your building principal for that person's name and telephone.

The district policies and procedures are on file in the superintendent's office and may be reviewed there.

You may file a complaint regarding a district policy or procedure. Please contact the superintendent and receive the specific process for the legislation for which you believe the district is in noncompliance.

Weapons-Free School Zone

Comstock Public Schools is a Weapons-Free School Zone. Violators may face expulsion and/or criminal prosecution. Firearms of any type are prohibited, as are knives, bow and arrows, and any type of explosive devices.

Drug Prevention

In accordance with Federal and State Law, the Comstock Public Schools Board of Education hereby establishes a "Drug-Free School Zone" that extends 1,000 feet from the boundary of any school property. The Board prohibits the use, possession, concealment, delivery, on property, within the Drug-Free School Zone or at any districtrelated event. Furthermore, the Superintendent shall take the necessary steps to ensure that an individual, eighteen (18) years of age or older, who knowingly delivers or distributes controlled substance on designated and prohibited by Michigan statute within the Drug-Free School Zone to another person is prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law.




